
A village where people who make a living through fishing gather to live.






predominantly **fieldwork**, many small-scale paddy farming operations





7. The Reality of Women and Youth Labor




Possible to engage in traditional fisheries

However, facing high entry barriers in fisheries

(learning fishing skills, acquiring fishing vessels and equipment, securing fishing grounds, etc)

Participation or entrepreneurship in rural businesses

However, entry barriers still exist (business networks, workforce, fishing grounds, living facilities, etc.)



Skilled workers in fisheries but undervalued, lacking self-recognition as 'fishermen'

The necessity and participation in rural businesses are high, but there is a lack of related knowledge, insufficient intermediate support organizations, and inadequate research in the field.

8. Entry Barriers in Fisheries and Fishing Communities



in Fishing sector

- Acquiring fishing skills,
- Purchasing fishing vessels and equipment,
- Securing fishing grounds (including fishing rights),
- Securing living facilities such as housing.

in Fishing village

- Established fishermen bothering newcomers,
- Closeness within the rural and fisheries community and organizations,
- Regulations within the village
- Age-based hierarchical structure.
